## SILVER MOUNTED SADDLE By PHILIP FREDHOLM & OUT WEST SADDLERY

This exceptional saddle was custom-made for H. T. Harrison, the creator of "No-Doz". This is the only known silver mounted saddle made by the proprietor, Alberto A. Cuen, of Out West Saddlery. Out West Saddlery was located on Main Street on Old Town Square in Los Angeles, CA.

The silver work on this particular saddle, including breast collar and bridle, was beautifully made and engraved by Edward Bohlin's master silversmith Phillip Fredholm (1890-1969). Looking at this saddle one can see how Fredholm was among the most accomplished silversmiths of his day. He was commonly known as the premier craftsman for Edward Bohlin and the finest silversmith of the Hollywood era.

In conversation with Charles L. Sample, Sr., who was an employee of Edward Bohlin—and also worked with Phillip Fredholm—Charles tells that: "In the 1920's, Bohlin had filed bankruptcy. He could not pay us, therefore Fredholm contracted his work out to Out West Saddlery for this particular saddle." Fredholm went on to become partners with Mike Morales, after Morales moved from Portland, Oregon. They opened a shop together at 2213 Sunset Boulevard, in Los Angeles, California where Fredholm was the tool and die maker for the partnership. Out of all this time in the business, **THIS SADDLE IS THE ONLY ONE KNOWN TO BE SIGNED WITH HIS NAME.**

Fully flower tooled, this impressive saddle is important for it's historical vaquero influence, the exceptional craftsmanship and artistic design is outlined below:

- The swells & horn are fully covered with sterling silver & are engraved with Fredholm's dazzling floral design.

- It's terrific high cantle is heavily bound in sterling silver and is also floral engraved by Fredholm.

- The large skirts are bordered with engraved 2" silver conchos and studs.

- The skirt corner plates are adorned with Bohlin's steerheads.

- The saddle strings are embellished with rectangular ferrules, each individually engraved by Fredholm.

- Each tapadero, measuring 24", is outlined with 2" silver conchos and large engraved silver corner plates.

- The matching breast collar is ribboned with engraved conchos, the center concho measuring over 3" and mounted with a large 14kt gold steerhead.

- It's fantastic bridle is heavily mounted with engraved conchos, buckles and cheek plates.

- It also has a 14kt gold steerhead centered on the brow band and gold flowers down the nose piece.

- It is fitted with a marked Bohlin bit and a fantastic pair of round silver ferruled reins with an engraved slide.

- Incredibly unusual, the silver is clearly marked "**Fredholm, Hollywood**", on the back of the diamond-shaped concho on the headstall nose piece.

*This is a monumental saddle, beginning with it's makers whom were key players in western history, as well as being the only saddle known to be marked with their names. For finishing touches, nothing was spared for quality. It was made approximately in 1932, shows no wear, and is in wonderful condition. There is nothing this saddle doesn't have, and is truly a museum piece.*
